CURRICULA

Program: Welding Technology Program (delivered in First Institute's **Mobile Welding Lab**):

Description: The Welding Technology Program's curriculum is based on an industry standard textbook, *Welding Principles and Applications*, Larry Jeffus (7th edition), Delmar Cengage Learning. A series of workbooks and lab manuals that are supported by the American Welding Society (AWS) School Excelling through National Skill Standards Education (SENSE) will supplement the textbook.

The curriculum will be taught through a combination of textbook, lecture and lab, with an emphasis on applying what has been taught via textbook and lecture in the welding hands-on laboratory.

The *Welding Technology Program* will meet for a total of 150 hours (Monday-Friday, 6 hours per day for 5 weeks).

Program content includes:

- Occupational orientation
- Introduction to Welding Technology
- Shop Math
- Blueprint Reading for Welders
- Drawing and Welding Symbol Interpretation
- Weldability of Metals
- Weld Inspection/Testing
- GMAW (Gas Metal Arc Welding)
- Safety and Health of Welders
- AWS Welding Certification Testing for GMAW certification (last day of class)

Students are required to wear

- long-sleeve shirts that do not have cuffs, frays, or rolled sleeves
- long work pants/jeans
