Plumber installs, repairs, maintains and services piping and plumbing systems and equipment used for drinking potable) water distribution, sanitary storm water systems, and waste disposal.

Classroom schedule for Apprenticeships: Classroom training held August through May, 2 nights per week, 3 to 4 hours per year-long segment for 5 years. Participant may enter apprenticeship at advanced level based on assessment process; however, MUST complete ALL levels to earn program certificate of completion, license, and Journeyman's card. Student will be linked to an employer for hands on training. Upon completion of a five-year apprenticeship program the apprentice will have earned 32 credit hours toward an Associate Degree from an accredited college.

Work Based Learning – Base on Assessment Ranking Score, Local 23 union places student with an employer.

Assigned to work in Winnebago, Boone, Stephenson, Ogle, JoDaviess, or Carroll Counties. Work is under terms of a collective bargaining agreement. Work schedule based on work/project schedule. Apprentices who do not complete the required hours of on-the-job learning during a given segment shall have the term of that segment extended until the required number of hours are accrued.

Requirements Prior to Filling Out Application:

- Must be 17 year of age to apply and 18 years of age by following March
- Must be a high school graduate or have a high school equivalency (Example: GED)
- Must have passed one year of standard high school algebra (HSE meets requirement)

Requirements – Day of Application:

- Cashier's Check or Money Order payable to JATC for \$20.00 (non-refundable application fee)
- *Valid/current driver's license or State issued ID
- Application MUST BE COMPLETED IN THE LOCAL 23 TRAINING DEPARTMENT at 4525 Boeing Drive, Rockford, IL 61109 (see application dates schedule and sample application on website: <http://www.ualocal23.org> – go to Apprenticeship Opportunities tab).

* If selected, must have a valid/current driver's license, reliable transportation, and be physically able to perform duties of the trade with or without reasonable accommodations. Further instruction will be provided if selected.

Requirements Immediately After Applying or prior to deadline (January 8, 2018):

- High School Transcripts or HSE/GED results must be submitted with official seal or faxed directly from the school or HSE/GED office to training department (fax 815-397-8912). NOTE: No transcripts will be accepted prior to submission of application. (No later than deadline – January 8, 2018)
- Completed Personal Experience Form (CPE) will be distributed at the time of application, it must be submitted along with any trade-related training and experience-supporting documents no later than the deadline (January 8, 2018).

Failure to have required documentation submitted by January 8, 2018 will disqualify applicant from the selection process.

If all of the above requirements are met within the specified time frames, successful applicants will be scheduled for the Aptitude Test on the date and time listed on the current year application. Those scoring below the minimum cut score will be notified via mail/email that they failed to meet requirements and will be disqualified from the selection process. Applicants that scored at or above the minimum cut score will be scheduled for an interview during the month of March. Interview, PEF, and test scores will be combined into a ranking number that will be mailed/mailed by the end of May.

A **2 part Drug Test** (hair follicle and urinalysis) is required prior to acceptance into the apprenticeship program and randomly throughout the training program.
